Bradford County Fire Rescue Community Resource Paramedicine Program Update Oct-Nov 2024

Meridian Partnership

- CRP program now has the ability to provide a direct referral to Meridian for substance abuse programs, detox, etc.
- Agencies will work together and have an active role in the future Post Overdose Response Team (PORT).
- Meridian has agreed to provide a peer support specialist for substance abuse related calls during normal business hours of operation (with the stipulation that it will not interfere with staff member's primary job duties).
- Both agencies continue to meet in regards to exploring the idea of a medication assisted treatment program within the jail system.

Medication Assisted Treatment

- Framework for an MAT program through Bradford County Fire Rescue has been created.
- The medical director has tentatively approved medications and protocols.
- The MAT program will be combined into the PORT team once established.
- Bupenorphine will be primary medication to treat substance abuse patients, in addition to supplementary medications.
- Mobile Support Unit (old bookmobile) will be utilized to mobilize to those patients with inadequate transportation.

Post Overdose Response Team

- Framework for an overdose response team has been completed.
 - Composed of a Peer Support Specialist, Licensed Mental Health Counselor, BCFR staff member.
 - \circ $\;$ Staff for all positions have been identified and are under review.
 - The team will respond within 24 hours of an overdose to provide access to treatment, resources, and guidance. Once fully operational, MAT services will be offered if the patient meets program guidelines.

Internship Program

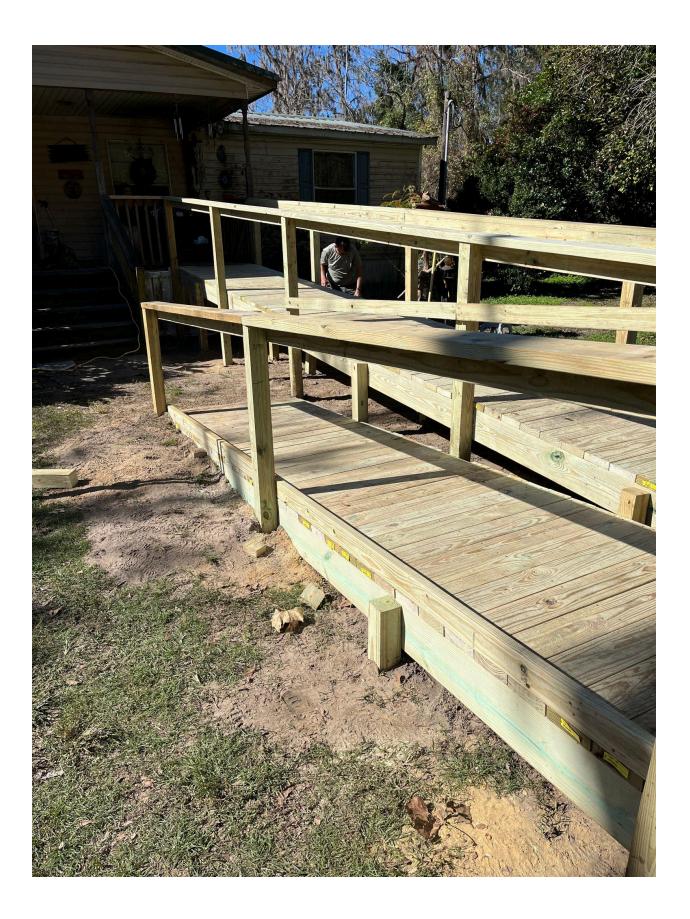
- Two interns will begin to work with the CRP program in January of 2025.
 - Bachelor's level students from the University of Florida's Applied Physiology and Kinesiology program will complete 520 credit hours focused on community health improvement projects.
 - Interns will present their projects at the end of their term.

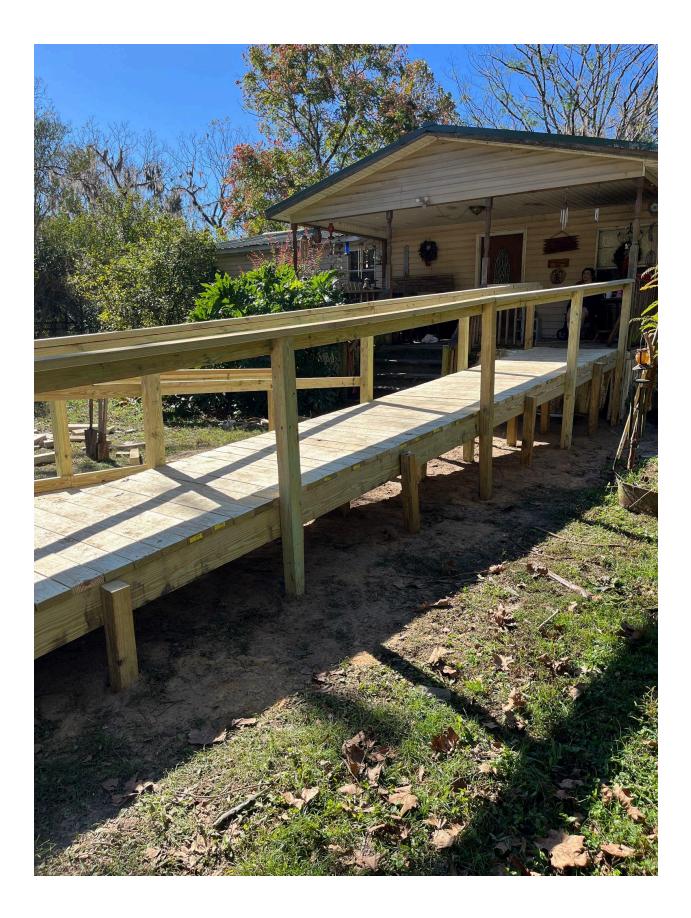
Community Spotlight

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. <u>Acceptance</u>. The purchaser identified on the first page hereof ('**Purchaser**') and Nextran Corporation, a Florida corporation d/b/a Nextran Truck Centers ('**Dealer**') hereby agree that these Terms and Conditions are incorporated into, and constitute an integral part of, the Sales Agreement governing Purchaser's purchase of motor vehicles from Dealer as more particularly described on the first page hereof.

2. Purchaser's Payment of Charges. Purchaser shall pay all charges arising out of or associated with this Sales Agreement, whether correctly stated on page one of this Sales Agreement or otherwise, including without limitation all tag, license, tire, battery and lien fees, and all federal, state and local taxes. 3. Deposit. Upon the execution of this Sales Agreement, Purchaser shall pay to Dealer a non-refundable deposit in the amount set forth on the first page of this Sales Agreement. If Dealer fails to deliver the motor vehicle(s) as contemplated herein, Purchaser's sole remedy against Dealer shall be a return of the deposit as liquidated damages in full settlement of any and all claims relating to this Sales Agreement, and Purchaser hereby waives any claims to the contrary. If Purchaser fails to pay the balance of the Selling Price, fails to take delivery of the motor vehicle for any reason or otherwise breaches its obligations under this Sales Agreement, Dealer shall be entitled to retain the entire deposit as liquidated damages in full settlement of any and all related claims. 5. Warranties. DEALER MAKES NO REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES OTHER THAN THE MANUFACTURER'S WARRANTY ON NEW MOTOR VEHICLES. ALL USED MOTOR VEHICLES ARE SOLD BY PURCHASER "AS IS, WITHOUT WARRANTY," EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED. DEALER SPECIFICALLY DISCLAIMS ALL WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR USE OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE(S) SOLD UNDER THIS SALES AGREEMENT, ALL OF WHICH PURCHASER HEREBY WAIVES TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW. Purchaser acknowledges that no person is authorized to make any representations or warranties to the contrary, whether oral or written. (Initials of Purchaser)

6. Purchaser represents that it (i) is a incorporated or formed under the laws of the state of _______, (ii) is located in FL and (iii) intends to use the vehicle(s) purchased hereunder only in the State(s) noted on first page hereof and the Certificate. If Purchaser will register the vehicle(s) in, or primarily use the vehicle(s) purchased hereunder in, either the State of California or the State of Oregon, Purchaser must indicate on first page hereof and in Certificate. If Purchaser fails to Notify Dealer in advance of vehicle(s) being ordered that the vehicle(s) will be registered in, or primarily used in, either the State of California or the State of Oregon, Manufacturer or any other entity.

7. <u>Limitation of Liability, Waiver of Claims</u>. Purchaser shall have the right to fully inspect the motor vehicles sold under this Sales Agreement at the time of delivery. Dealer shall not be liable for, and Purchaser's acceptance of such motor vehicle constitutes Purchaser's waiver of, any and all claims, causes of action, losses and damages arising out of Dealer's sale of the motor vehicle to Purchaser, including without limitation any and all actual, incidental or consequential damages arising out of: a) loss, damage or delays for any reason; b) failure to supply any property ordered hereunder; c) loss of use, loss of time, lost profits or income; d) changes in design, materials or specifications; e) modifications to the motor vehicle performed by others; and f) defects in design, materials or workmanship, in each case with respect to the motor vehicles purchaser pursuant to this Sales Agreement. Purchaser acknowledges that this waiver constitutes a material inducement from Dealer to consummate the transactions contemplated in this Sales Agreement and is subject to no exceptions.

8. 9. <u>Modifications by Others</u>. Purchaser acknowledges that any requested modifications to the motor vehicles subject to this Sales Agreement to be performed by others are Purchaser's sole responsibility, and Purchaser shall pay Dealer for the cost of such modifications, regardless of whether Purchaser takes delivery of the vehicle. Dealer is not liable for any defects in design, materials or workmanship, or any errors or omissions by such third parties.

10. <u>Trade-in Allowance</u>. The trade-in allowance set forth on page one of this Sales Agreement is based upon an appraisal by Dealer of the trade-in described herein in its present mechanical condition and with the equipment and attachments described on Dealer's appraisal sheet. Such trade-in shall be subject to reappraisal at the time of delivery of the motor vehicle to be sold hereunder. Purchaser shall be liable for any differences in the trade-in allowance due to changes in mechanical condition, equipment or attachments.

11. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Sales Agreement constitutes the complete and exclusive statement of the terms of the agreement between Purchaser and Dealer concerning the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements, understandings, negotiations and discussions of the parties, whether written or oral. No modification, course of conduct, amendment, supplement to or waiver of this Sales Agreement shall be binding unless made in writing and signed by both Purchaser and Dealer.

12. <u>Assignment</u>. This Sales Agreement may not be assigned by Purchaser without Dealer's prior written consent, and any attempted assignment by Purchaser shall be null and void. Subject to the foregoing, this Sales Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, successors, permitted assigns and legal representatives. There are no third party beneficiaries of this Sales Agreement.

13. <u>Governing Law: Consent to Jurisdiction, Waiver of Right to Trial by Jury</u>. This Sales Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be governed by, and construed and interpreted in accordance with, the laws of the State of Florida, without giving effect to the conflict of laws principles thereof. Venue for any litigation, legal action or other proceedings arising out of or relating to this Sales Agreement shall lie solely in the courts of the State of Florida located in Duval or Dade County, Florida. Purchaser and Dealer (a) agree that such courts shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any matters arising out of or related to this Sales Agreement and (b) hereby waive any and all claims to the effect that any of such courts constitutes an inconvenient forum. THE PARTIES HEREBY IRREVOCABLY AND UNCONDITIONALLY WAIVE ANY RIGHT THEY MAY HAVE TO A TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY SUIT, ACTION, PROCEEDING, OR COUNTERCLAIM ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THIS SALES AGREEMENT.

14. <u>Miscellaneous</u>. Risk of loss shall pass to the Purchaser upon delivery of the motor vehicle sold under this Sales Agreement. A facsimile of this Sales Agreement shall have the same legal effect as an original hereof. In the event of any litigation arising out of this Sales Agreement, the non-prevailing party shall reimburse the prevailing party for the reasonable attorneys' fees and other expenses incurred by the prevailing party in connection therewith.

INVESTMENT GRADE AUDIT AGREEMENT

This Investment Grade Audit Agreement ("<u>Agreement</u>"), dated ______ ("<u>Effective Date</u>"), is entered into by and between Schneider Electric Buildings Americas, Inc. ("<u>ESCO</u>") and <u>Bradford County</u> <u>Comission ("Customer</u>").

WHEREAS, Customer wishes to engage ESCO to perform an Investment Grade Audit to (i) identify energy conservation measures ("<u>ECMs</u>") that are available to and appropriate for Customer's facilities, (ii) determine the guaranteed savings that would result from implementing such ECMs as part of a comprehensive energy conservation improvement program, and (iii) propose a scope of work and project price for ESCO's implementation of such ECMs under and pursuant to an Energy and Construction Services Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth, ESCO and Customer hereby agree to the following terms and conditions:

SECTION A: GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between ESCO and Customer and supersedes all prior oral or written understandings relating to the subject matter herein. This Agreement may not be amended or modified except by written instrument signed by a duly authorized representative of each party.

2. Services

As described more fully in Section B, ESCO will conduct an Investment Grade Audit of certain Customer Facilities (defined below) in order to (i) identify ECMs that are available to and appropriate for such Facilities, (ii) determine the guaranteed savings that would result from implementing such ECMs as part of a comprehensive energy conservation improvement program, and (iii) propose a scope of work and project price for ESCO's implementation of such ECMs (the "IGA"). Upon conclusion of the IGA, ESCO will provide Customer with a report describing the scope and results of such IGA (the "IGA Report"). Customer acknowledges that the IGA is not intended to serve as a comprehensive inspection of Customer's Facilities and that, to facilitate the IGA and to assist ESCO in identifying and recommending ECMs appropriate for Customer's Facilities, Customer is responsible for providing ESCO with all such access, knowledge and history as may be relevant to ESCO's analysis, including, without limitation, with respect to Customer's Facilities, systems, and equipment, as well as its accounting, maintenance, and operation practices.

3. Confidentiality

Neither party shall disclose to others any Confidential Information. "<u>Confidential Information</u>" shall mean all information or material, whether revealed orally, visually, or in tangible or electronic form, that is competitively sensitive material not generally known to the public that relates to the business of a party to this Agreement, or any of their respective interest holders, unless such information: (i) was already rightfully known and in possession of the receiving party at the time of disclosure by the disclosing party; or (ii) is in or has or will be entered into the public domain through no breach of this Agreement or other wrongful act of the receiving party; or (iii) has been rightfully received by the receiving party from a third party who is not known by the receiving party to be under obligation of confidentiality to disclosing party and without breach of this Agreement; or (iv) is independently developed by receiving party without reference to the Confidential Information; or (v) is approved for release by written authorization from the disclosing party. This confidentiality obligation shall terminate two (2) years from the date of this Agreement.

4. Insurance

ESCO and Customer shall each maintain insurance coverage, including without limitation, workers' compensation and employer's liability at statutory limits and commercial general liability insurance covering public liability and property damage with limits generally required for its respective industry with not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$2,000,000 general aggregate. Such insurance shall be with reputable and financially responsible carriers authorized to transact business in the state in which the Facilities are located and the services are being performed with an A.M. Best's rating of at least A- VII.

5. Governing Law

This Agreement will be governed, interpreted and construed by, under and in accordance with the laws, statutes and decisions of the state in which the Facilities are located, without regard to its choice of law provisions.

6. Ownership of Work Products

All drawings, specifications and other documents and electronic data furnished by ESCO to Customer under this Agreement ("<u>Work Products</u>") are deemed to be instruments of service and ESCO shall retain all ownership and property interest therein, including any copyrights and other intellectual property rights. Such Work Products are furnished solely for purposes of allowing Customer to evaluate whether it wishes to execute an Energy and Construction Services Contract with ESCO and, in the event Customer does enter into an Energy and Construction Services Contract with ESCO, for use in connection with ESCO's performance of the proposed Project (defined in Section B below). Work Products are not intended to be, and shall not be, used or relied upon by Customer or any third party for designing or performing any portion of the proposed Project, and Work Products may not be shared with any third parties without the written permission of ESCO, except to the extent required by law.

7. Due Authority of Signatories

Each party represents and warrants that this Agreement constitutes the legal, valid, binding, and enforceable obligation of such party, and that neither the execution nor performance of this Agreement violates any law, rule, regulation, or legal duty applicable to such party. Each party further represents and warrants that the execution of this Agreement is within such party's legal powers, and that each individual executing this Agreement on behalf of such party is duly authorized to do so by all necessary and appropriate action and does so with full legal authority.

SECTION B: AUDIT SERVICES

1. ESCO agrees to provide Customer with the following:

- A. An IGA of each of the facilities described under Section C (each, a "<u>Facility</u>"; collectively, the "<u>Facilities</u>");
- B. An IGA Report setting forth:
 - i. a list of the ECMs recommended for each Facility;
 - ii. a description, based upon the information made available to ESCO during the IGA, of how the recommended ECMs would interact with the existing equipment in the Facilities;
 - iii. a financial analysis calculating the impact the ECMs would have on annual cash flow;
 - iv. a utility analysis outlining the impact the ECMS would have on Customer's utility expenses;
 - v. a proposed scope of work to be performed by ESCO (the "Project"); and
 - vi. proposed pricing for ESCO's performance of the Project, which such pricing will be honored by ESCO for sixty (60) days following delivery of ESCO's IGA Report to Customer; and
- C. A draft Energy and Construction Services Contract to be entered into if Customer elects to move forward with the Project.

2. <u>Customer agrees to provide ESCO with the following:</u>

- A. A list of any requirements and/or specifications that Customer expects to be included in and/or associated with the scope of work;
- B. Complete access to the Facilities (including remote network access as appropriate) and to information concerning the Facilities, including without limitation such Facility access and information as will enable ESCO to accurately perform an energy efficiency analysis, measure actual energy use, take equipment inventory, determine operating schedules, and identify known operational deficiencies;
- C. Access to key personnel to discuss operating requirements;
- D. Copies or loans of building plans and other such documents for the purpose of facilitating ESCO's understanding of the Facility characteristics and the current sequences of operation; and
- E. All other insight, knowledge and history as may be relevant to ESCO's analysis, particularly with respect to the operation, maintenance and energy efficiency of the Facilities, as well as disclosure of all known or suspected deficiencies, defects and malfunctions of or affecting the Facilities or the systems, components and equipment therein.

3. Payment:

- A. Within sixty (60) days of receiving the IGA Report, Customer shall either (i) execute an Energy and Construction Services Contract with ESCO, or (ii) pay ESCO an exit fee in the amount of \$34,872 (the "<u>IGA Exit Fee</u>"), provided, however, that no IGA Exit Fee shall be owed if ESCO is unable to guarantee annual energy and/or other cost savings that meet or exceed the cost of the proposed Project over a term not to exceed 20 years.
- **B.** If Customer does execute an Energy and Construction Services Contract with ESCO, the costs and expenses incurred by ESCO in the performance of services under this IGA Agreement and in the development, design and/or engineering of the Project will be included in the "Project Price" to be paid by Customer under the Energy and Construction Services Contract.

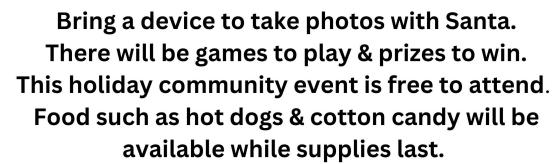
