- 8. AGRICULTURE EXTENSION DEPARTMENT SAMARA PURVIS, EXTENSION DIRECTOR
- A. UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA/IFAS BRADFORD COUNTY EXTENSION <u>PRESENTATION</u> SAMARA PURVIS AND DR. ERIC SIMONNE, NORTHEAST EXTENSION DISTRICT DIRECTOR

Mr. Sexton provided opening comments explaining the purpose of this presentation and introduced Dr. Eric Simonne to open the presentation.

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Dr. Simonne provided comments describing his role as liaison between the Board and UF/IFAS; the role of the Extension Office as providing researched information to support citizen needs; and the functions of a Live Stock Agent, a position currently vacant in Bradford County. Dr. Simmone indicated that UF is no longer under a hiring freeze and as such is prepared to partner with Bradford County in filling the vacant Live Stock Agent position, a jointly funded position - 60% (UF)/40% (Bradford County).

Dr. Simonne introduced the following Extension Agents to provide an overview of services and programs offered through the Bradford County Extension Office:

- Samara Purvis Extension Director and 4-H Agent
- Luke Miller Horticulture Agent
- D'Alicia Straughter Family and Consumer Sciences Agent

In closing the presentation, Ms. Purvis provided a summary describing the responsibilities and value of a Live Stock Agent.

Commissioner Spooner made the following comments:

- Requested that the Extension Office provide assistance to a citizen interested in raising earth worms. Ms. Purvis stated that the Extension Office could assist.
- Expressed the importance of the Extension Office.
- Recognized Samar Purvis, during Black History Month, as the first African-American female Extension Director and 4-H Agent in Bradford County.

Commissioner Andrews made the following comments:

- Made known citizen calls she received concerning the vacant Live Stock Agent position.
- Thanked Extension Office staff for their hard work.
- Asked for more media coverage of programs and services offered through the Extension Office.

Commissioner Thompson and Vice-Chair thanked the Extension Agents for the services they provide.
