Board member Steve Futch opened the meeting with prayer at 12:05 PM

**Approval of the minutes from the January meeting**, motion to approve was made by Chuck Kramer the motion was second by Steve Futch, motion passed 9-0.

**Financial Report accepted** A motion to accept was made by Steve Futch the motion was second by Frank Durrance, the motion passed 9-0.

Pam Whittle and Kim McKinley discussed the application referring to page 5 where television commercials on channels 12, 25, and 4 from Jacksonville market as well as channel 20 from the Gainesville demographic will be utilized to promote Bradford County and the event. Radio advertisement will also be used from various markets, locally 106.3, and in the Gainesville / Ocala market 103.7 and 98.5. Various forms of print media, newspaper and digital ads will also be used to bring in tourists for the 2 day event to Bradford County. The total advertising budget will between 13 and 18 thousand dollars. NFCRR will receive funding from other sources of sponsorship to help with this cost, so the Bradford County TDC will be a large supporter of the event. NFRCC will follow all guidelines set forth in the application packet. There will be a social media campaign; visibility via the event website, the information will be posted on the website Visit Natural North Florida. The Bradford County TDC logo will also be displayed on all flyers and posters. North Florida Regional Chamber of Commerce requested \$7,500.00 from the Bradford County TDC to hold the 21st Annual Bradford County Strawberry Festival. Shane Bennett made a motion for the TDC to grant the Bradford County Strawberry Festival the amount of \$7,500 for advertisement of Bradford County and the event, the motion was second by Paula Register, the motion passed 9-0.

An application from the RJE Alumni Scholarship Committee for a Gospel Fest to be held April 13, 2019 was reviewed by the board as well. No one from the committee was present to discuss the event with the board, but all TDC board members were given a copy of the application. The portion of the application that deals with advertisement was reviewed, as well as the duration of the event. It was determined by the board that this event did not meet specific criteria needed to grant funding. Steve Futch made the motion to refuse funding due to not meeting the criteria of heads on beds, etc...Vincent Esson second the motion, the motion passed 9-0.

Construction and repair projects at the Conference Center were discussed for the month of March. An extended training that will be held for a 5 day period by the county fire training officer, at no cost to the county Feb. 28 to March 5. March will be a touch month financially with little to no income that month.

The situation of the parking lot around the Conference Center was discussed again by the board. Mr. Miller talked of meeting with the county engineer and being advised against paving the area, so other alternatives were mentioned such as lime rock or millings, just to keep folks from getting stuck when we were experiencing inclement weather in the area. Vincent said he would check with some of his connections to see if there may be another alternative.

Mr. Miller asked that the next TDC meeting be conducted at the Conference Center so that everyone could have some hands on time in the building.

The Board asked staff to research availability of billboard signage on the North and Southern ends of Truck Route, as far out as Waldo, or Clay Hill areas on both ends. Kim will get with Clear Channel and Cox to see what is available within the next few months. Vincent said he would also assist with signage and the design. That report will be given at the March meeting.

A discussion held by the board to help increase visitors to our county, with some ideas that were tossed around during a short brainstorming session. The board members were each asked as "Homework" to bring in 3 ideas to promote tourism in the county next month. Those ideas would then be ranked to determine what would be a project for the TDC board in the very near future.

Steve Futch made a motion to adjourn at 1:07 the motion was second by Frank Durrance, the motion passed 9-0.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BRADFORD COUNTY, FLORIDA CONFIRMING A PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY IN BRADFORD COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on March 5, 2011, the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida adopted Ordinance 2001-05; later codified as Chapter 26 of the *Bradford County Code of Ordinances* (hereinafter referred to as the *Code*) invoking the powers provided for in Chapter 252, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 26-8(a) of the *Code*, the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida granted authority to the Emergency Management Director to declare, by proclamation, a state of local emergency from time to time when it is determined that conditions exist giving rise to such a declaration, and;

WHEREAS, according to Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, the duration of each state of emergency declared locally is limited to seven days and may be extended, as necessary, in seven-day increments; and

WHEREAS, in late September 2017, Hurricane Irma, a major, extremely powerful, catastrophic tropical cyclone, rated as a Category 4 storm on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale, made landfall in the Florida Keys and moved north across the Florida peninsula causing strong winds, torrential rainfall, major, widespread flooding and other damaging effects throughout its path; and

WHEREAS, the devastating effects of Hurricane Irma – specifically including destroyed and damaged roadways and bridges, accumulated debris, downed trees and power lines, lost power, destroyed homes and other serious damage, particularly damage resulting from flooding – were felt by Bradford County and its residents; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that a significant contributing factor to the flooding in Bradford County caused during and after Hurricane Irma was the presence of a large number of downed trees, tree limbs and other vegetative debris which impeded the flow of water in Sampson River and Alligator Creek; and

WHEREAS, the effects of Hurricane Irma resulted in an increase in the downed dress, tree limbs and other vegetative debris which continues to impact the flow of water in Sampson River and Alligator Creek; and

WHEREAS, on or about November 29, 2017, the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida entered into a *Memorandum of Agreement for Cost Share Assistance* with the Suwannee River Water Management District which provided approximately \$225,000.00 in funding for the removal of vegetative debris in Sampson River; and

WHEREAS, on or about July 13, 2018, the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida entered into a *Notice of Grant and Agreement Award* with the United States Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Services, which provided approximately \$2,500,000.00 in funding for the removal of the vegetative and other debris in Sampson River and Alligator Creek; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida, together with the Bradford County Sheriff, as Emergency Management Director, developed the Sampson River/Alligator Creek Tree Removal and Flood Abatement Project to implement the aforementioned agreements with the Suwannee River Water Management District and the United States Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Services and to remove the vegetative and other debris in the Sampson River and Alligator Creek; and

WHEREAS, on or about July 19, 2018, the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida entered into an *Agreement* with Southern Disaster Recovery, LLC (SDR) to complete the Sampson River/Alligator Creek Tree Removal and Flood Abatement Project; and

WHEREAS, in order to complete the Sampson River/Alligator Creek Tree Removal and Flood Abatement Project, Bradford County and SDR will be required to enter onto certain areas of private property and certain areas within the waterways of Sampson River and Alligator Creek; and

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2019, the Bradford County Emergency Management Director declared and proclaimed a local state of emergency in Bradford County, Florida for the purpose of providing access to said property and waterways which is necessary to complete the Sampson River/Alligator Creek Tree Removal and Flood Abatement Project – so as to provide relief from the emergent, flood-related conditions which currently exist in Bradford County – for the period commencing on February 27, 2019 and continuing through March 5, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida finds that the aforementioned declaration of a state of local emergency for the period commencing on February 27, 2019 and continuing through March 5, 2019 was and remains in best interest of Bradford County, Florida and its citizens.

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida as follows:

#### Section 1. Adoption and Incorporation of Recitals.

The Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida adopts the above-outlined recitals and incorporates them herein as part and parcel of this resolution.

#### Section 2. Purpose and Authority for Resolution.

This resolution is adopted for the purpose of confirming the February 27, 2019 proclamation by the Bradford County Emergency Management Director declaring a local state of emergency in

Bradford County, Florida, for the purpose of providing access to said property and waterways which is necessary to complete the Sampson River/Alligator Creek Tree Removal and Flood Abatement Project – so as to provide relief from the emergent, flood-related conditions which currently exist in Bradford County – and is adopted pursuant to the authority granted by Chapters 125 and 252, *Florida Statutes*, Chapter 26, *Bradford County Code of Ordinances*.

#### Section 3. Confirmation of Proclamation and Declaration of Emergency.

The Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida hereby confirms the February 27, 2019 proclamation by the Bradford County Emergency Management Director declaring a local state of emergency in Bradford County, Florida for the purpose of providing access to said property and waterways which is necessary to complete the Sampson River/Alligator Creek Tree Removal and Flood Abatement Project – so as to provide relief from the emergent, flood-related conditions which currently exist in Bradford County, which is attached hereto as "Exhibit 1" and incorporated herein by reference, and declares a local state of emergency in Bradford County, Florida for the period commencing on February 27, 2019 and continuing through March 5, 2019.

#### Section 4. <u>Effective Date of Resolution.</u>

This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the Board of County Commissioners of Bradford County, Florida.

When our Office proposed to provide Architectural and Engineering Services for subject project dated, 2 June 2017, almost a year and a half ago, we proposed to provide these services anticipating construction to take about 150 calendar days. It appears now, that construction may be not be completed till late February (about 353 days) over twice as long as projected.

Because construction time has been extended, so has our time and expenses for services. Over this extended time, our Office has continued to monitor construction, produce Field Reports, attend monthly meetings, process pay applications, evaluate and administer change orders, and assist in coordination with your Office and the Contractor. In our original proposal, our Office had expected to accomplish field visits in sequence with other work being accomplished for Bradford County (SHIP Rehab work) which has been only nominally effective.

Costs for review of shop drawing and submittal data were projected to be accomplished by way of one review per discipline which has not been the case. The Contractor has submitted/ resubmitted shop drawings and submittal data for nine or more disciplines three or more times incurring additional time, costs and resources. A detailed shop drawings and submittal data list may be provided if requested.

In our afore mentioned proposal, I had projected a cost of \$12,952.50 for Construction Administration and Substantial Completion but, exceeded those cost per our Invoice dated 27 June 18. So far our Office has attended 15 site visits and produced Field Reports and has attended seven monthly meetings, not counting Substantial Completion / Punch List Inspections and Completion and Close Out reviews and inspections. Our Office has assembled a spread sheet with time and expenses accumulated from the beginning of Construction Administration anticipating Substantial Completion of construction by the end of February to be \$30,218.75 or \$17,266.25 over projected income. Projected time, services & expenses from today to Substantial Completion our office expects to incur additional costs of \$9,600.00 for a total of accrued and projected expenses of \$26,866.25.


